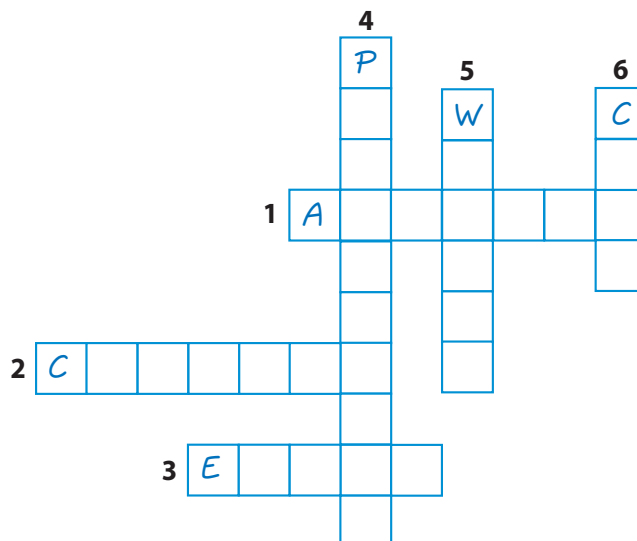

This will allow teachers to make a more informed decision about which examination individual students should sit for. Specific books and/or practice tests can then be used accordingly to prepare students for these examinations.
